REGIONAL STRENGTHS

Driving Growth Across Wales

1–Anglesey Freeport *North Wales*

Anglesey Freeport is transforming the north into a global hub for low carbon energy, data/AI, manufacturing, and international trade. Centered around Holyhead Port, Prosperity Park, Parc Cybi, Rhosgoch, and the M-SParc Science Park, the Freeport supports the UK’s transition to clean energy through projects in nuclear, hydrogen, and marine renewables. Backed by £25 million in seed funding, it is forecast to generate 5,000 high value jobs across advanced data/technology, logistics, and energy. This strategic location, at the crossroads of the Irish Sea and European trade corridors, demonstrates how North Wales is harnessing innovation to drive sustainable prosperity.

2–Celtic Freeport *South West Wales*

Spanning Milford Haven and Port Talbot, the Celtic Freeport is a flagship clean energy and industrial decarbonisation initiative; it will power the net zero transition through floating offshore wind, hydrogen, sustainable fuels, manufacturing, energy storage and port logistics. The Freeport is expected to create up to 11,500 skilled jobs and attract £8.4 billion in private investment. An Industrial Strategy Zone, strategically located near two deep-water ports, offers excellent rail, road, sea and pipeline connectivity. Supported by highly competitive investment incentives, it features strong workforce development through local training and upskilling initiatives, plus an innovation network linking academia, industry and research centres. The Celtic Freeport exemplifies the Welsh commitment to connecting people, skills and technology in pursuit of a cleaner, stronger economy.

3–Flintshire and Wrexham Investment Zone *North Wales*

The Flintshire and Wrexham Investment Zone builds upon a well-established advanced manufacturing region. Focused on the key strategic sites of Wrexham and Deeside Industrial Estates, Warren Hall and land surrounding Hawarden Airport, it benefits from £160 million in joint UK and Welsh Government funding to accelerate research, productivity, and job creation. Airbus, Toyota, JCB, AMRC and many others are advancing next generation processes in aerospace, automotive, and low carbon technology. The area is also supported by the North Wales Growth Deal and is enhancing export infrastructure and supply chain capabilities that reach into North West England and Europe. This vibrant industrial heartland is a model of cross border connectivity, flexibility, and ambition.

to commercial opportunity. A joint UK and Welsh Government initiative, delivered by Cardiff Capital Region, this Investment Zone is accelerating growth in R&D and innovation. With a focus on sustainable development and inclusive prosperity, South East Wales is a magnet for international investment.





Overview

We exist to unlock sustainable growth across North Wales—bringing together six local authorities and partners to turn regional strengths into a pipeline of credible, deliverable opportunities for investors and businesses.

As an ambitious regional body, we work collaboratively with public and private sector partners to drive sustainable, inclusive economic growth while enhancing social and environmental wellbeing.

Building on our regional strengths and addressing long-standing market barriers, we are delivering transformational programmes through a £160m Investment Zone – focused on advanced manufacturing, alongside a £240m Growth Deal, targeting Digital Connectivity, Land & Property, High-Value Manufacturing, Low-Carbon Energy, and Agri-food & Tourism. Together, these investments will unlock up to £2bn of total investment by 2036 and support the creation of up to 10,000 new jobs.

By creating a connected, resilient, smart and sustainable region, we are strengthening skills, developing and retaining talent, enabling business growth, and accelerating innovation across North Wales.

Strategic Benefits

North Wales is ready for investment and growth. We take a regional approach – aligning transport, land use, and economic development into a coherent, place-based system that connects people, businesses and opportunities.

To the east, the Flintshire and Wrexham Investment Zone builds on a globally significant cluster of advanced manufacturing excellence, strengthens by powerful cross-border links into the Northwest of England.

To the west, Anglesey – our energy island – is at the forefront of low carbon innovation. It is set to host the UK's first nuclear small modular reactor, is home to a new Freeport designation, and will play a key role in the North Wales AI Growth Zone.

Across the region, we are accelerating digital connectivity as a critical enabler of productivity, innovation and inclusive growth. Our ambitions are underpinned by a clear and focused skills strategy – ensuring a strong pipeline of talent to meet the evolving needs of our priority sectors and support long-term economic resilience.

Commercial Opportunity

North Wales offers a compelling proposition for investors—built on strong partnerships, delivery momentum, and a clear pipeline of opportunities.

- The Flintshire and Wrexham Investment Zone will act as a catalyst for growth, reinforcing – the region's position as a leading location for advanced manufacturing. Its £160m, ten-year funding package creates a highly attractive platform for inward investment.
- The Anglesey Freeport provides a distinctive offer, with tax, customs and regulatory advantages designed to accelerate trade, innovation and development.
- With a designation of an AI Growth Zone, North Wales is positioning itself at the forefront of emerging technologies – creating new opportunities for data-driven and AI-enabled businesses and investors.
- At Wylfa, one of the UK's most strategically significant energy sites, plans for new nuclear development present a major long-term investment opportunity in clean, reliable power generation.

Alongside this, the North Wales Growth Deal is unlocking a portfolio of projects across multiple sectors, targeting up to £1bn of total investment by 2036. North Wales is an emerging powerhouse – rich in opportunity, strong in delivery, and ready to partner with investors to realise its full potential.
